Structure of Learning

You will be studying the Junior Cycle Programme for 1st, 2nd and 3rd year (please see Junior Cycle leaflet). 4th year is known as Transition Year (TY), this is a fantastic way to broaden your learning with the usual academic subjects whilst sampling new subjects, engaging in on and off-site activities, work experience, going on trips and developing a range of new life-skills. 5th and 6th year are known as the Senior Cycle where you will study 7 subjects in preparation for your Leaving Certificate.

A Typical School Day

School starts at 8.45am each day. Monday school finishes at 4pm, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday school finishes at 3.40pm and on Wednesday school finishes at 1pm.

The day is divided into six 1-hour classes. (4 classes on Wednesday). We have 2 classes then break for 15 minutes (10.45-11am) 2 classes then lunch for 40 minutes (1-1.40pm) and then 2 classes and we finish for the day.

Locker Area

You will have a locker area with the rest of your year group. Every student will have their own locker where they can store their books and belongings – make sure you have a lock for your locker for September.

Extra-Curricular Activities

We also co-host the school show with the PBS which is a great way to broaden your skills and friend base.





Support Systems

All will be explained to you in more detail in August at your induction day. Some supports are HFY, Class Tutor, Year Head, Guidance counsellor, teachers.
